

Day 1 | 17th November 2024

Arrival in Osaka

Welcome to Japan! You will be met at Osaka airport (Itami or Kansai) and transferred to your hotel by shared transfer. The remainder of the day is at your leisure to relax and explore Osaka. *Overnight in Osaka*

Day 2 | 18th November 2024

Kobe Sake Barrel Factory & Kobe Beef Lunch

Today we travel to Kobe, a city that seamlessly blends tradition and modernity. We visit the Sake Barrel Meister Factory, a fascinating destination where the intricate craftsmanship of sake barrel production comes to life. The workshop offers our guests a first-hand glimpse into the traditional artistry and meticulous techniques behind the creation of these essential vessels for Japan's renowned rice wine. A sake museum visit and tasting is included. Afterwards we enjoy a delicious lunch featuring the famous Kobe beef (vegetarian alternative available). Overnight in Kobe (B,L)

Day 3 | 19th November 2024

Himeji Castle and Kokoen Garden

Today we explore the stunning architecture and rich history of Himeji Castle, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of Japan's most well-preserved castles. Immerse yourself in the captivating stories of samurai culture as you wander through the intricate maze of defensive structures. A visit to the beautifully landscaped Kokoen Garden of Himeji Castle's Western Residence is included with our visit. Overnight in Kobe (B,L)





Day 4 | 20th November 2024

Okayama including Korakuen Garden

Exploring Okayama is a captivating journey through time and nature, where the majestic Korakuen Garden stands as one of Japan's three most beautiful gardens, offering a serene escape with its meticulously landscaped ponds and traditional teahouses. The iconic Okayama Castle, surrounded by lush greenery, creates a harmonious blend of history, architecture, and natural beauty. The day is at your leisure to relax and explore Okayama, before rejoining your group for a magnificent multi course Japanese banquet dinner in the evening. Overnight in Okayama (B,L,D)

Day 5 | 21st November 2024

Kurashiki (day trip from Okayama)

After a short train ride from Okayama, we arrive at Kurashiki Village. Step back in time and experience period of the ambiance Japan's Edo seamlessly preserved in its historical architecture, cobbled streets, and traditional canal-lined landscape. The highlight is the Bikan Historical Quarter, where picturesque canals, weeping willows, and white-walled warehouses create a scene reminiscent of bygone eras. Strolling along the Kurashiki Ivy Square offers a glimpse into Japan's past, with merchant houses now transformed into charming cafes, boutiques, and museums. Overnight in Okayama (B,L)

Day 6 | 22nd November 2024

Pottery Kiln and Nagafune Sword Museum

Today we venture from Okayama to Bizen, one of Japan's most acclaimed pottery villages. The village exudes a timeless ambiance, with traditional kilns and pottery studios dotting the landscape, showcasing the rustic beauty of this revered pottery style. Learn about the history and techniques from a family making pottery for 26 generations, then create your own Bizen Pottery masterpiece. We also visit the Nagafune Sword Museum, which not only displays an impressive collection of finely crafted swords but also provides insight into the meticulous process of sword making, highlighting the craftsmanship and symbolism behind these iconic blades. Overnight in Okayama (B,L)

Day 7 | 23rd November 2024

Naoshima (Art Island)

A short bus trip and ferry ride brings us to Naoshima, home of the famous Benesse Art Project. The Benesse House Museum, designed by architect Tadao Ando, proves to be a sensorial delight with its seamless integration of art, architecture, and nature. The Chichu Art Museum, nestled partially underground, showcases masterpieces by James Turrell, Claude Monet, and Walter De Maria, creating a harmonious dialogue between light, space, and art. The Art House Project, scattered across the island, invites exploration of traditional houses transformed into contemporary art installations. Overnight in Takamatsu (B,L)





Day 8 | 24th November 2024

Ritsurin Garden

After an overnight stay in the port town of Takamatsu, our morning is spent exploring Ritsurin Koen. The garden's uniqueness lies in its meticulously crafted Japanese landscape design, blending classical beauty with serenity through exquisite ponds, sculpted hills, and meticulously pruned pine trees. Takamatsu is also famous for its Sanuki Udon Noodles, so we will roll up our sleeves at lunchtime to make the wheat noodles before savouring our Sanuki udon for our lunch. Overnight in Takamatsu (B,L)

Day 9 | 25th November 2024

Onomichi (Seto Inland Sea)

Today we travel to Onomichi, a region famous for its charming islands and historic sites. This inland coastal town boasts picturesque landscapes, historic temples, and a laid-back atmosphere. We will have the afternoon free during our stay, so why not consider Onomichi's scenic Temple Walk, a picturesque trail lined with traditional Japanese temples and stunning views of the sea. Alternatively, you may rent an electric bike and explore parts of the Shimanami Kaido an undulating cycling route with its awe-inspiring bridges connecting islands across the Seto Inland Sea. Overnight in Onomichi (B,D)

Hiroshima and Miyajima


We finish our Setouchi Reflection Tour with a two night stay in Hiroshima, a city that offers a poignant blend of cultural exploration and historical reflection. We visit the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park and Atomic Bomb Dome, both symbols of the city's resilience and commitment to peace. A highlight of our visit includes a ferry ride to Miyajima Island, home to the revered Itsukushima Shrine and its famous "floating" torii gate. We also have a chance to indulge in Hiroshima's renowned okonomiyaki, a savory pancake layered with various ingredients. Overnight in Hiroshima 2 nights (B,L)
